The Director of Communications oversees a small team of staff and consultants.

This is a leadership role, responsible for achieving all of DFER's communications goals, with two primary objectives:

- Significantly increase DFER's positive, earned media in influential media outlets, both nationally and in our states, with a focus on left-leaning and progressive audiences; including raising the profile of DFER's national senior leadership and state chapter directors.
- Build strong relationships with reporters, editorial boards and other influencers such that they regularly seek our perspective on major education issues/stories in key markets.
- Expand our reach and spread our message via social media campaigns, paid media, podcasts, coordinating staff for conferences and high profile speaking opportunities

- Results orientation: track record of setting and achieving goals and a bias for action and producing results; thinks metrics are inspiring, not distracting; perseverant in the face of obstacles
- Relationship building: able to connect with individuals and build trust with and
 influence a wide range of stakeholders from diverse backgrounds, including
 reporters, our internal leaders (national and state-based), funders and others
- Project management: manage multiple projects without dropping balls;
 backwards plan and anticipate obstacles; identify and involve stakeholders appropriately; use resources wisely
- Strong knowledge of education reform and commitment to our mission: can
 articulate the central conflicts and political challenges in our work and how those
 relate to communications strategy; interest in education politics and advocacy on
 both a national and state legislative level. Understanding of our key policy areas:
 choice, accountability, human capital, resource equity, and high school to higher
 ed quality and affordability.

- Experience with elected officials, political campaigns and candidates a plus, not a requirement
